**2026 Visitor Guide**

The Toronto Biennial of Art's mission is to make contemporary art accessible to everyone. A twelve-week event every two years, the Biennial commissions artists to create new works for a city-wide exhibition in dialogue with Toronto's diverse local contexts. Year-round public and learning programs bridge Biennials and invite intergenerational audiences to explore the ideas that inspire our events. Building upon past editions and offering new ways of seeing and listening, each Biennial connects people to spark meaningful dialogues and imagine new futures.

## Curatorial Vision

The fourth edition of the Toronto Biennial of Art, *Things Fall Apart*, curated by Allison Glenn, unfolds through a set of propositions anchored by the question: What can we learn from artists who explore rupture as an ontological tool or a way of understanding?

Relying on the shared geographies of the Great Lakes as a place of departure, this Biennial traces relationships between the expansive but interconnected waters of the Great Lakes region and over sixteen global waterways, trade routes, and voyages that span five continents. *Things Fall Apart* considers ideas of syncopation and disruption through the lens of shared thematics that emerged from artists' voices: diaspora through movement and migration, syncretic traditions, notions of borders, water networks, maritime histories of empire, corporeality, calls to action, global climate justice, genocides, speculative and science fictions, material memory, the transformation of knowledge, and both water and land as conceptual links.

*Things Fall Apart* is organized in three parts: a central exhibition that grounds itself in methodologies of collectivity, sovereignty, reflection, and refusal; a series of performances and artist-led programming that invites embodied engagement with these practices; and a collaboratively curated gathering.

# Programs

TBA Programs are for audiences of all ages, and explore the artistic practices running through *Things Fall Apart*. Artist-led programs branch out from the exhibition to offer opportunities for focused engagement, deepened connection, and thoughtful exchange. Artists are further engaged, along with educators and other collaborators, to create a meaningful learning guide, freely accessible at TBA's main partner site, the Art Museum at the University of Toronto, as well as online.

Public and learning programs take many forms—conversations, workshops, performances, storytelling sessions, and more. We invite you to further explore our public programming and learning streams:

**Public Programs** are interdisciplinary moments of engagement envisioned by the 2026 TBA curator and exhibiting artists, and shaped by collaborations with partners. They include new Biennial commissions, performances, a three-day convening, artist talks, panel discussions, and more.

**Mobile Arts Curriculum (MAC)** is a collection of learning resources developed by artists and centring decolonial practices through the arts. Each learning activity supports and expands learning curricula, building upon the curatorial ideas explored in each Biennial edition.

**Storytelling Program** offers visitors of all ages new ways of engaging with the artworks presented in the Biennial by offering participatory sessions in the exhibition spaces. For each edition, local multidisciplinary artists are commissioned as Storytellers and offer booked and drop-in tours throughout the duration of the Biennial.

**School Programs** are led by Storytellers who engage with students and educators through artist-led, narrative, and embodied sessions and workshops in response to the artworks presented in the Biennial. Learn more or book a visit on our website.



# Publication

TBA's 2026 catalogue, entitled *Things Fall Apart: Notes on Rupture*, explores ideas of syncopation and rupture through a variety of artistic practices. Bringing together the 30+ artist projects featured in the Biennial exhibition, this book offers dynamic engagement with our contemporary moment and provides a platform for future thinking. It features an in-depth essay by curator Allison Glenn, a roundtable conversation with Biennial advisors from across Canada, and a multitude of voices and approaches, offering a compendium of ideas, insights, and thinking alongside Glenn's curatorial concepts. *Things Fall Apart: Notes on Rupture* is available to purchase online as well as through local, national, and international retailers. It is co-published by the Toronto Biennial of Art, Art Museum at the University of Toronto, and Goose Lane Editions, with contributing publisher Aga Khan Museum.

We are excited to announce the launch of TBA Parallel Projects, a new initiative supporting the visibility of local exhibitions featuring work by artists participating in *Things Fall Apart*. Taking place during the Biennial period, the initiative aims to amplify the vibrant artistic activity happening across the city. **Public Transit:** All Toronto Biennial of Art sites are accessible by TTC, Toronto's safe and affordable public transit system. A single adult trip costs \$3.35 and day passes are available for \$13.50. For schedules and routes, please visit [ttc.ca](http://ttc.ca).

**Walking & Driving:** Many Biennial sites are located in clusters in the East and West ends of the city making it easy to walk or cycle from site-to-site. **UP Express:** TBA exhibition sites fall across three UP Express stops. Move quickly from one site to another by hopping on at one of these stations: Union, Bloor, or Pearson. 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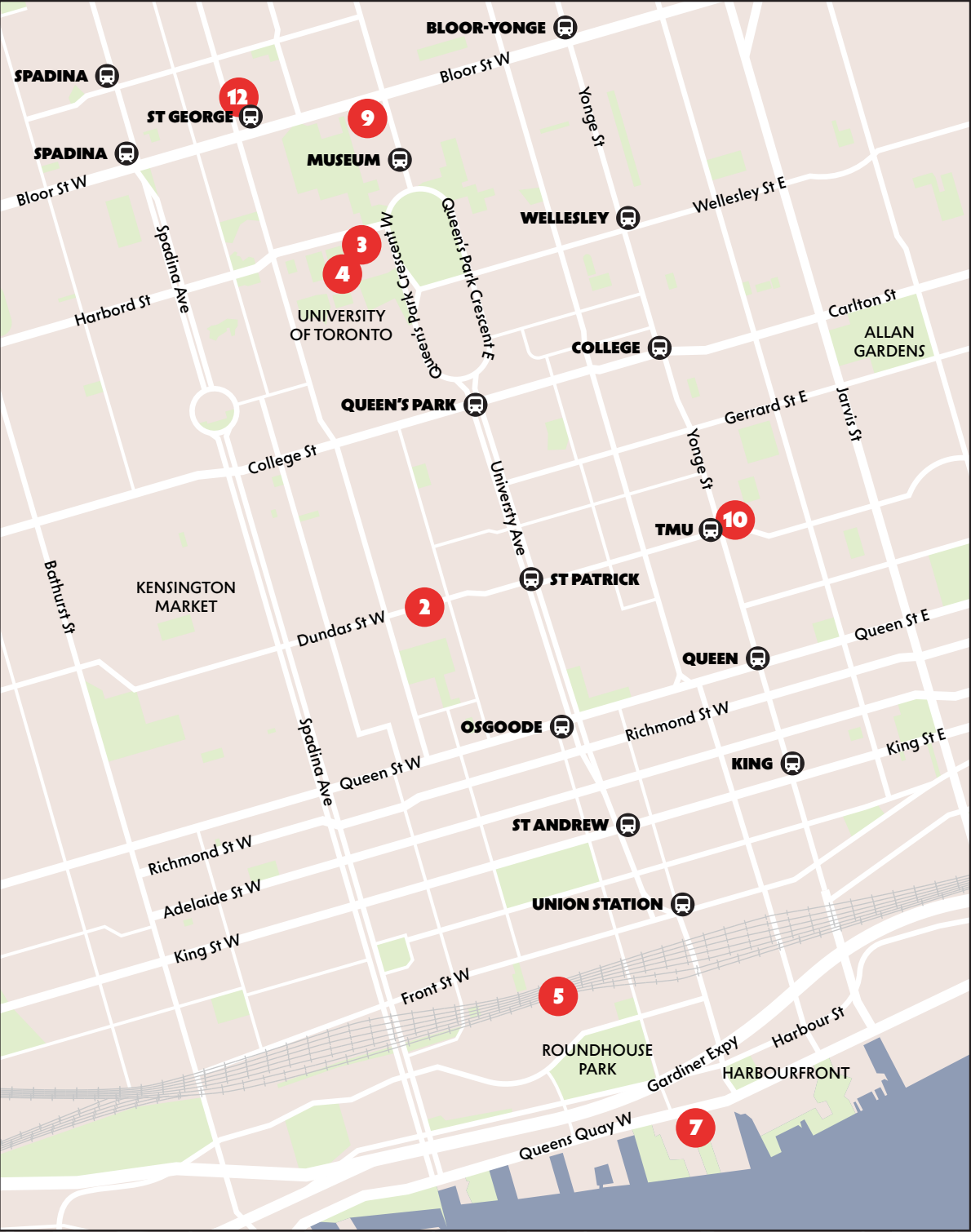
